Martin Luther himself wrote that his motives for the Reformation movement grew primarily out of pastoral concern for the members of his congregation in Wittenberg. When he learned of the indulgences being sold by John Tetzel in neighboring communities, and that his members were buying them, he recognized that they were being offered false hope. In short, they were being "ripped off" (not Luther's phrase).

Luther tried several approaches to keep this evil from coming to his parishoners, including preaching against the entire concept of indulgences. The more he looked into this practice, the more he recognized how harmful this idea was to Christian hope and faith. It finally led him, on October 31, 1517, to post his now-famous 95 Theses against indulgences, and thus launch the German Reformation.

Eventually, this movement would become embroiled in national and global politics, military actions, and a divide within the Christian church. This was not Luther's intent. His was first a concern for the spiritual welfare of Christ's redeemed people.

As we observe the anniversary of the 95 Theses this month, it would be an excellent time to remind ourselves that our mission and ministry must also be about concern for the spiritual welfare of all those for whom Christ came and offered up Himself. We can get so caught up in doing "churchy" things that we forget what it means to be the Church.

Luther understood that being the Church meant bringing Christ to people, especially to people who do not know Him, or who have drifted away from Him. That is the Church's mission and ministry. We do that through many means — direct witnessing, sharing our own faith with others; caring service, helping people experience the love of Christ; and bringing people to the Word and Sacraments, where Christ is always found.

As we honor the history of the Reformation, we need also commit ourselves to extending its goals and purposes — to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ alive in the hearts of all people. We can do that only with the people we encounter. We can support others who go out in our stead to work in places we cannot go. In either case, the driving motive remains our concern for those who may be led away from Christ by many allurements, and restore them in loving relationship to Christ.

Someone you know needs that ministry. Someone only you can reach needs to experience Christ's grace. In the spirit of the Reformation, bring the Good News to that person's life this month.

Jesus heals ten lepers, makes them clean. He tells the one who came back that faith made him well. See the difference?




#### October 20 — October XIX


Pastor Just but we would like to also celebrate you! St. Thomas wouldn't be here without you!


**Sunday School** has started. I would love to see more children join us. We meet in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 a.m. Please join us this Sunday!
