HAPPY THANKSGIVING

"And be thankful."

With those three words (Colossians 3:15b) St. Paul adds a dimension to his instructions to the Colossians that transforms those instructions.

The duties to which Paul summons these Christians (and all of us, as well) are: "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly: teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:12-17 NRSV)

This is how Christians are to live in the world and in community with one another. But smack dab in the middle of all of these directives comes that phrase, "And be thankful." It is as if Paul wants us to know that, whatever may come our way — good or bad, beneficial or

harmful, joyous or sorrowful — we meet it all with thanks.

This is not always easy to do. When life tosses grenades onto our path, we don't think of giving thanks. Rather, we are inclined to complain, sometimes most bitterly. If this is our honest reaction to events or circum-stances, then by all means we need to express it — and should express it to God. The giving thanks part comes when we realize that we can thus lament before God and that God makes His presence known to us, not just in good things, but in the midst of some of life's most awful goings-on.

So we can gripe. We can moan. We will cry. We will hurt. We may become frustrated, dejected, or angry. There will be times of laughing, cheering, and celebrating. There will be times of victory, accomplishment, and blessing. We can voice our praise, our joy, our hope.

But we need always to keep in mind these three words: "And be thankful." For, in the midst of what life throws our way, God is at work in it all, working for our good. As we approach Thanksgiving Day, let's not limit our thanks to a big meal or even a bountiful harvest. Let's offer up thanks for all that God is doing in our lives and, above all, that He is with us.





November 3 — All Saints Sunday
