

"It isn't really alive, that why it's so hard to kill it."

That's how the coronavirus was described in one online article. That's not quite so easy for me to wrap my head around, but then I don't have any expertise is the field of virology (or any other medical field). I think I am with a majority of people who tend to think that something is either alive or dead, and that we should be able to tell the difference.

Often, critics of the New Testament write as if the people in Biblical times lacked knowledge of life and death, which is why they thought Jesus was dead when, in fact, he was still alive on the cross (this is sometimes referred to as "the swoon theory"). This theory, in some form or another, seems to have been around from the very beginning of the Passion/Easter narrative. St. John records in his Gospel that, when Jesus' side was pierced by a spear, "blood and water" issued forth; that described separated blood (plasma and serum), one sign that the body has ceased to function—in other words, he was dead. John must have felt the need to offer this proof.

It is somewhat foolish to think that ancient peoples, most of whom lived around animals all the time, could not discern life and death. That Roman soldiers, especially skilled in killing, would mistake a live man for a dead corpse and remove from the cross is ludicrous. They knew death. So the critics who think otherwise simply want to think otherwise.

In that, I suggest, they are akin to the coronavirus — never really alive. It is an all-too-common condition. Many people have never really experienced the fullness of life because they have not experienced the fullness of Christ. Too many people think that existing is all there is to living so they limp along, surviving. Christ does not want us merely to survive; He desires that we thrive. For that, we need to be fully in Him.

As we continue through this period of struggle, dealing with this previously unknown virus that is wreaking havoc around the world, we respond in many ways: fear, anxiety, frustration, anger, boredom, disappointment, sadness — almost all of them negative. Christ invites us to hold on to joy, hope, peace — all of which we gain when we realize that we rest in His love. That is how we thrive; that is how we are fully alive.

As you "shelter in place" during this pandemic, don't be content simply to get through it. Know that Christ in going through it with you and in you. Be fully alive in Him, and know joy.

## April 5 — Palm Sunday / The Sunday of the Passion

We gather outside the sanctuary for the blessing of the palms and the reading of the Processional Gospel, and we enter in singing "Hosanna" as did the throng that welcomed Jesus. Texts: Matthew 21:1-11; Psalm 31; Zechariah 9:9-10; Philippians 2:5-11; Matthew 26:14-27:66. Pastor Just's sermon is: "Humble ... Like Jesus?" [Because of the restrictions caused by the coronaviruis, we are not able to secure palms for our celebration. Pictures of palms will be made available and, of course, we each have two palms on our bodies that we can wave in joyful praise.]




April 9 — Maundy Thursday Upper Room Communion 7:30 PM We gather around the Lord's Table as did the Twelve with Jesus in the upper room to share the gift of His Body and Blood, but our focus is also on the prayer of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Texts: 2 Peter 1:1-11; John 13:1; Matthew 26:26-28, 31-35; Luke 22:31-33; Matthew 26:36, 43a, 47, 49, 50b; John 19:16-18, 28; Matthew 27:48-49. Pastor Just's sermon: "The Rock." The service concludes with Stripping of the Altar in preparation for Good Friday.



## April 10 — Good Friday Tenebrae Service

7:30 PM

In this traditional service of darkness, we reflect on the Passion of Our Lord interspersed with hymns and songs. Texts: Isaiah 52:13-53-12; Hebrews 4:14-16, 5:7-9; John 18:1-19:42. Pastor Just's sermon: "Orphans." The service ends with a reading of the prophecies about Christ's death as candles are extinguished and we end in total darkness.



### April 12 — The Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord

We celebrate our Lord's victory over death and the grave as we gather to sing His praises and rejoice in His presence. Texts: Jeremiah 31:1-6; Colossians 3:1-4; Matthew 28:1-10. Pastor Just's sermon: "The Broken Seal." [We do not yet know if we will be able to offer our traditional Easter Pancake Breakfast; a phone call will alert you if we are able to go ahead.]



### April 19 — Easter II

Sermon: "Take a Good, Hard Look"

Texts: Acts 2:14a,22-32; Psalm 148; 1 Peter 1:3-9; John 20:19-31

Thomas refuses to believe the witness of the other disciples. Jesus forces the issue by insisting that he do what he said he needed to do to believe.



### April 26 — Easter III

Sermon: "Foolish? Slow? Or both?"

Texts: Acts 2:14a, 36-41; Psalm 116; 1 Peter 1:17-23; Luke 24:13-35

When He encounters the disciples on the road to Emmaus, Jesus is less than complimentary about their faith. How might we fare?
