FORMED

We are told in the opening lines of Genesis that "the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep" (1:1 [NRSV]). It took the creative action of God speaking His Word to create form, that is order, out of the formless. Thus did God begin all things; He provided form.

The prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah declare God's message that He "formed you in the womb." This is a very personal way of communicating that every one of us is the result of God's purposeful act of creation. It tells us that

God did not wind up His creation like a clock and leave it sitting on a shelf; He is always intimately involved with what He has created, including and especially us.

When Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate of the tree from which they were told not to eat, this perfectly formed world became deformed — it was no longer in the form that God intended it to have. St. Paul affirms that the creation became subject to a "bondage to decay" (Romans 8:21 [NRSV]), and was itself, as are we, in need of freedom. We, whom God formed, have become deformed in our sinfulness.

This month, we celebrate that Martin Luther and others led a movement to reform the church. They recognized that the church had lost the form given it by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost; that form had been based on grace and faith. The church of the sixteenth century had deformed into one based on works and power. Luther and the rest called the Church back to its original form, insisting that the heart of the Gospel was not performance but God's unconditional acceptance of every one of His children, acceptance that had been demonstrated and secured in the death and resurrection of Christ.

But to find reform it is necessary to conform. The image of Christ is the template to which we must aspire. We are to be conformed to Christ in our living out the Gospel. This means we must learn from Christ's example to become more sacrificial, less self-centered; more loving, less judgmental; more God-oriented, less worldly. It is one thing to admire Jesus and His teachings; it is something much more to be empowered by the Holy Spirit to live into them. To be conformed to Christ requires great discipline and attention.

But Paul takes it yet a step further when he calls us to "not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2 [NRSV]). The transforming power of the Gospel is that the Holy Spirit works through Word and Sacrament to provide such a radical difference in our lives that we can hardly explain the change. True transformation is not just cosmetic updating; it is a deep, very personal, and very radical change in our thinking, believing, and doing. The Holy Spirit is constantly positioning us for such change; we cannot close ourselves off from what the Spirit seeks to do in our lives.

A song by Larry Holder and Elton Smith expresses it well:

From the beginning of time was a plan

That all who believe understand:

Salvation is ours as a gift, through God's only Son. (Mercy and Grace, Copyright © 2003)

Thus does God take the unformed, form it in love, and when deformed, He reforms, conforms and transforms to reflect His glory. For that, we give Him praise and worship.

Sermon: "Stuck inside of Mobile (with the Memphis Blues Again)""


Texts: Jeremiah 31:31-34; Psalm 46; Romans 3:19-28; John 3:16-21

Has the message of the Gospel been distorted by the many messages we hear daily? We need to pay closer attention to what Jesus has to say.







Jeanette is asking everyone to send Jim a birthday card.






