One of the promises of the Gospel is that God's people are renewed in Christ.

It has become customary for many people as they begin a New Year to make some resolutions that are designed to renew oneself: lose weight, quit



smoking, exercise more faithfully, read more good books, take more time off, pray more diligently, attend worship more regularly, control one's temper, spend more time with the family, get organized, smile more, laugh more, save money, become a "better person" (did I miss any?).

I am convinced that those of us who make such New Year's Resolutions are quite serious and intend to pursue those laudable goals we set before ourselves. Yet, inevitably, with rare exceptions, we come up short . . . the diet doesn't quite work out; smoking is much harder to quit that we imagined; time for exercise gets swallowed up in weekly demands; the pile of good books hasn't gone down appreciably; the weekly planner gets just as filled with little gaps for time off; our prayer life stagnates; worship on Sunday is held hostage by the pillow's allure; stressed, we lose control more often than we care to admit; our grand plans for "a place for everything" don't quite materialize; we find less to smile over; and less yet about which to laugh; and we just don't see ourselves as having made much change for the better.

Self-improvement is doomed to failure; the fact is we cannot improve ourselves. God does not say to us: "Get yourself in shape!" or "Try a little harder this year." He says, "I make all things new."

What God asks of us is not that we seek self-improvement, but that we seek Him. He does not ask us to set goals that become nothing but new sources of frustration, and then guilt, for us. He bids us to come into His presence, sit quietly with Him, meditate on His Word, be fed and nourished by that Word, come into contact with His people in community, and let the Holy Spirit do the work in us that we need to be done.

He promises that when we are in touch with Him — intimately in touch — we will be renewed. That's much better than improved. We don't take our old selves and produce a slightly better model; He takes our old selves and provides us a whole new identity — we are transformed into the likeness of Christ. We cannot do that; but He can! We can only make a bad thing slightly less bad; He gives us something altogether new, altogether whole, altogether wonderful. And as He is making us new, He is renewing the whole creation — all things!

Draw near to this God of newness, and watch Him reshape, renew you into the instrument of His purpose and the child in whom He takes utter and complete delight.

Jesus taught with authority and healed with power. Does His Church have either of those qualities? Can we use them?



If you have subscribed before, you still need to enter your name as a new subscriber. Remember: January 18 is the deadline.

On January 18, the Church marks the day of The Confession of St. Peter, recalling Peter's words about Jesus: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" On January 25, the Church marks the day of The Conversion of St. remembering Paul's encounter with Christ on the Damascus Road. The week intervening is called The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. It is obvious to all that Christ's Church lacks unity; there are over 800 Christian church bodies in the United States, many of them the direct result of two parties that could not agree and split. We have Christians who refuse to worship together, pray together, work together, even talk together. All are sure they are very right, or at least more right than others. It infects not only church bodies (like synods and denominations) but individual congregations (like St. Thomas?). In many ways it is a sad situation; it surely saddens our Lord who Himself prayed: "Holy Father, keep them in Your name, which You have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11).

I urge you to join me in earnest prayer this month — each day from January 18 to 25 — asking that the Holy Spirit fill our hearts, first and foremost, and then the hearts of all Christians, so that the walls of distrust, disagreement, and disharmony may be dismantled.
