

- L: O Jesus Christ, we, and many whom we know, are dealing with sicknesses and illnesses, physical disabilities and chronic pains.
- C: We are in search of a Healer.
- L: We are battling temptations of every kind, and are so often being overpowered by the presence of sin in the world.
- C: We are in search of a Savior.
- L: We are often unable to understand what is happening around us, and we desire to learn more about ourselves and about our God.
- C: We are in search of a Teacher.
- L: We are often threatened by danger and uncertainty, fearful of calamities and accidents, concerned about possible mishaps and missteps.
- C: We are in search of a Protector.
- L: We often worry about money and finances, wonder about what we will eat and drink, and question whether or not we will have everything we need to live from day to day.
- C: We are in search of a Provider.
- L: We often are confused about which direction to take in our lives.
- C: We are in search of a Guide.
- L: Now may we who have searched for someone to heal us, save us, teach us, protect us, provide for us, and guide us...
- C: ...find what we are searching for in You, O Lord.

and spreads them like a tent to live in;

<sup>23</sup> who brings princes to naught,

and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing.

<sup>24</sup> Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth,

when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble.

<sup>26</sup> Lift up your eyes on high and see:

Who created these?

He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name;

<sup>25</sup> To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One.

because he is great in strength,

mighty in power,

not one is missing.

"My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God"? <sup>28</sup> Have you not known? Have you not heard?

## THE SECOND LESSON 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

<sup>16</sup> If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! <sup>17</sup> For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. <sup>18</sup> What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

19 For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. <sup>20</sup> To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. <sup>21</sup> To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. <sup>22</sup> To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. <sup>23</sup> I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings. This is the Word of the Lord.

## THE HOLY GOSPEL

The Holy Gospel according to Mark 1:29-39

C: Glory to you, O Lord

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. <sup>30</sup> Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. <sup>31</sup> He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. <sup>33</sup> And the whole city was gathered around the door. <sup>34</sup> And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

<sup>35</sup> In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. <sup>36</sup> And Simon and his companions hunted for him. <sup>37</sup> When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." <sup>38</sup> He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." <sup>39</sup> And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons. This is the Gospel of our Lord.

From the January 2021 edition of Faith in Action, a publication of the Faith & Freedom Coalition. Weekly Church Attendance Protects Mental Health During the Pandemic

According to Gallop, Americans assessed their mental health as being worse in 2020 than at any other time in the twenty years the organization has collected data. The Number of Americans who rated their mental health as good or excellent dropped an alarming nine points since 2019. Each year since 2001, Gallop has asked Americans to rate their mental and emotional well being as excellent, good, fair or poor. Between 81 and 89 percent of Americans have rated their mental health as good or excellent until it dropped to 76% in 2020. Only those who attend religious services weekly experienced improvements in mental health during 2020, a finding consistent with a study conducted last spring showing that 26% of Americans reported that the pandemic and lockdowns strengthened their faith. The Link between mental health and faith has long been established in medical literature.
