Affirmation of Faith Nicene Creed

Suffering in His body sin's deadly powers, He entered the captivity of hell and proclaimed liberty to those imprisoned by the unyielding force of death.

Breaking forth from the grave's stronghold, He pushed back the stone, met us on the road as a beloved stranger, and awakened in us the hope that the earth will be saved from its enemies.

Ascended into glory, He is everywhere present, gathering up all things in the surprise of new life and desire fulfilled.

Blessed is our brother Jesus, who walks with us the road of our grief, and is known again in the breaking of bread; who on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and said:

> This is My Body, which is for you, Do this to remember Me."

In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying:

"This cup is the new covenant in My blood, Do this, whenever you drink it, To remember Me."

So, as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

C: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

P: Therefore, here in this place, we celebrate the life that was born at Bethlehem, the life that Jesus has shared among His community through the centuries, and shares with us now.

Raised to life with Him, and united with each other in His mystical body, we lay before You these gifts of bead and wine, in token of our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, for here we offer and present to You ourselves, our bodies, minds and spirits, to be a holy and continuous sacrifice to You.

Come now, O Spirit of Christ, brood over these bodily things, this bead and this wine.

- C: May they be for us Your body and blood, vibrant with life, healing renewing and making us whole.
- P: And burst forth in us with Your life-giving power that we might recognize your presence in each and every person who breaks bread and shares wine round this table.
- C: Open our graves, unbind our eyes and name us here; touch and heal all that has been buried in us, that we need not cling to our pain, but may go forth with power to release resurrection in the world.
- P: Because You are one with us, O Christ, make us one with You as we pray the prayer You taught us:

The Lord's Prayer

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Communion

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very Body and Blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may honor His sacrifice by continuing His mission in the world. All are invited to take the communion packet that was provided as you came to worship this morning.

P: Take and eat, this is the Body of Christ, broken for you to be made whole.

All are invited to open the larger cup from the communion packet and partake of the wafer therein.

- P: Take, drink, the Blood of Christ, poured out for you to be filled with His endless life. *Please open the smaller cup to consume the wine.*
- P: The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ and His precious Blood strengthen and preserve you in true faith to life everlasting.
- C: Amen.
