# St. Thomas Lutheran Church — Streetsboro, Ohio

In this month of May we travel from Easter to Pentecost. We have been in the post-Easter season, in which we have heard repeated stories of our Lord's resurrection appearances to His followers. All of them serve to demonstrate that the resurrection was not the figment of anyone's imagination, but a reality — Jesus could be seen, touched, heard ... He ate, spoke, and drank with them ... the marks of His crucifixion were always visible. There could be no question in the minds of the disciples: this was Jesus who was crucified and He had truly risen.

These narratives serve a second purpose, as well. In each of these accounts, Jesus is preparing the disciples to go on without Him. They did not quite understand what that meant (as we often come to understanding only through hindsight). The Ascension was coming, which meant Jesus was going back to His Father. Had Jesus not shown Himself so often, the disciples might well have concluded that this resurrection business was a dream. But Jesus prepared them to understand that His departure was all part of God's plan, and that they had a coming role in that plan.

That role involved the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Even though the disciples had experienced many wonders in the three years they traveled with Jesus, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit was going to be a wholly new adventure. In every one of His appearances, Jesus is positioning them to be ready for that Spirit.

That is what the post-Easter season is for us, also. We are being positioned for Pentecost. What the Holy Spirit does in the life of the Church is so unique and so powerful that we must be readied to receive what God has to give. Often we are not ready, for we do not expect the radical change that the Spirit brings to our personal and corporate lives. We may not even want the change, for it will mean a profound difference in the way we live.

This is what the outpouring of the Holy Spirit means for us — life. We have the new life that Christ won for us in His death and resurrection because the Holy Spirit pours that life into us. We cannot seek it out; we cannot manufacture it; we cannot make this life ours. It is a gift, pure and simple. Because it is a gift, the only way we get it is when the Giver chooses to give it and in the manner the Giver chooses to give it. What we celebrate on the Day of Pentecost is that the Giver has chosen to give us this wondrous gift of life. We often may wish, though, that the manner used with the first disciples would be the manner used with us.

There are several symbols that are used to represent the Holy Spirit, most notably the dove and flames. Both of these come from the Bible: the dove appeared at Jesus' Baptism; the flames at Pentecost. The dove comes quietly, hovering, almost unobtrusively. The flames are accompanied with thunder, wind, noise, commotion. In our circles, most of us have had "dove experiences" with the Holy Spirit. We may long for "flame experiences." But there is yet another image, one not evoked by the Scriptures, but by technology. In a Baptismal hymn, we sing: "The Spirit's fission shakes the Church of God." Our experience of the Holy Spirit goes to the very foundation of who we are and what we must be. In Baptism, God the Giver provides for us a powerful transformation, the "basic building blocks" of our being are recreated.

The changes are not always overt, spectacular, or flashy — like flames. The changes are not necessarily gentle, mild, or cooing — like a dove. The changes are always substantial, life-altering, and dynamic — like nuclear fission. We travel this month from Easter to Pentecost. But we go way beyond that — into the transformed life Jesus won for us. Through the Holy Spirit, we now live for Him.




May 30 — The Holy Trinity
