

We are taking up two foci for Lent this year. On Thursday Midweek (but not Ash Wednesday), we are listening for how Jesus is with us "in the thick of things." On Sundays, we are listening to understand what we have been "Called to Be." It is hard to do the one and not do the other.

When the Holy Spirit leads us to trust that Jesus is true to His promises and is always present with us, at the same time the Spirit opens us to desire how to respond. The response from Christ's people to His loving presence is never, "So what?" It is always, "So what now?" Where will Christ take us in faith? What will He equip us to do? To whom will He send us? This is the response of faith—to go and do what Christ desires.

The first thing Christ desires is that we worship. Nothing is as central to the Christian faith and life as giving praise to God for His grace and mercy. Whatever else we may do in life, it begins and ends in worship. Our service, our giving, our understanding, our fellowship, our witness — none of these can happen apart from our life in worship. If we cut ourselves off from the worshiping community, we sever the connection to Christ.

It is in worship that we learn to forgive, to reconcile, to focus away from ourselves, to offer ourselves in joyous devotion. It is in worship that we realize that we are part of something much bigger and more important than our everyday lives. It is in worship that we are fed, nourished, and equipped to live as Christ wants us to live.

As we come together in worship during this Lent — both on Sundays and in our Thursday Midweek Lenten services — we will be energized as the Spirit speaks through the Word. We will discover the joy of knowing that Christ is with us in every circumstance, calling us to greater lives in His Kingdom.

Beyond our worship lie times for service, witness, teaching, caring, suffering, giving, relating. Some of us will be very busy at Kingdom work; others will be equipped and called to less active participation. All will be gifted by the Spirit for whatever tasks are set before them.

Plan to make this Lent a time when you encounter Christ more fully, and discover that He is always true to His promises. He will come to you, stand with you, and call you to a faith-life that is rich, active, and Spirit-filled.

March 6 — First Sunday in Lent

Sermon: "Called to be Conquerors"

Texts: Deuteronomy 26:1-11; Psalm 91; Romans 8:31-39; Luke 4:1-13

Paul says that we are "more than conquerors" through Christ. What can that

mean (take a look at Jesus in the wilderness)?



March 10 — Lenten Midweek 1

Sermon: "In the Thick of Temptation"

Texts: Genesis 3:1-8; Psalm 118; James 1:1-18; Luke 4:1-13

When Jesus faces temptation, he shows us that God how will be with us in

our times of struggles against whatever would lead us astray.



March 13 — Second Sunday in Lent

Sermon: "Called to be Reconciled"

Texts: Jeremiah 26:8-15; Psalm 4; Romans 5:1-11; Luke 13:31-35

Since we are bound to Christ, we have recieved from God the forgiveness we

need. The issue before us has to do with reconciling with others.



March 17 — Lenten Midweek 2

Sermon: "In the Thick of Crisis"

Texts: Genesis 15:1-18; Psalm 27; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 13:31-35

Jesus shows us three ways to manage the difficult times that so often disrupt

our lives.



March 20 — Third Sunday in Lent

Sermon: "Called to be Foolish"

Texts: Ecclesiastes 2:12-21; Psalm 63; I Corinthians 1:18-24; Luke 13:1-9 What does it mean to be "foolish?" Is this something we should embrace or repel?



March 24 — Lenten Midweek 3

Sermon: "In the Thick of Blindness"

Texts: Isaiah 55:1-9; Psalm 85; I Corinthians 10:1-13; Luke 13:1-9

How is it that we can so easily see sin at work in others and constantly miss it in ourselves? What does it take to "open our eyes?"



March 27 — Fourth Sunday in Lent

Sermon: "Called to be His Workmanship"

Texts: Joshua 5:9-12; Isaiah 12:1-6; Ephesians 2:1-10; Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32 God has done in us what we could never do for ourselves. Through the Holy

Spirit, we are given insight to know how precious is that message.



March 31 — Lenten Midweek 4

Sermon: "In the Thick of Humiliation"

Texts: Isaiah 12:1-6; Psalm 32; 2 Corinthians 5:16-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32 When the Prodigal Son finds himself destitute in a foreign land, he is swept up by humiliation. See what his father does about it.



April 3 — Fifth Sunday in Lent

Sermon: "Called to be Obedient"

Texts: Isaiah 43: 16-21; Psalm 126; Philippians 2:1-15; Luke 20:9-19

To obey, we must listen. But there is so much noise to distract from hearing what we need to hear. How do we "tune in?"



April 7 — Lenten Midweek 5

Sermon: "In the Thick of Deceit"

Texts: Isaiah 43: 16-21; Psalm 73; Philippians 3:4b-14; John 12:1-8

Is it possible we live in a world where deception is so common place we

have come to accept it as "normal?"

For our Fifth Sunday offering in January, we asked your support for Family & Community Services, Inc. located in Ravenna, serving all of Portage County. We are pleased to report that \$300.00 was sent to that charity in support of that mission.

A request came also from University Hospital Portage for support of their Department of Pastor Care. This provides care to patients from their pastoral staff; it also provides Pastor Just with information when one of our members is hospitalized there. The Church Council opted to send a \$50 donation.

With all the discussions these past few months about calling a Pastor to share our ministry with Christ Lutheran in Mantua, one issue that has been hovering in the background is finances. The two Call Committees have put together the financial pictures of both congregations, and it looks like there will be sufficient funding to proceed. A concern is that, if we call a Pastor, we want to ensure that the finances will be there "for the long haul." Council has talked about holding a brief session following our worship to inform the congregation just where things stand. Watch the bulletin for details about date and time.
