I have been in the habit of thinking, "Nothing happens in August." That may be because there is very little in August on what we know as "The Liturgical Calendar." [The day commemorating "Mary, the Mother of Our Lord" is a rather recent addition; the only long-standing commemoration day is that of "St. Bartholomew, Apostle."] Certainly, those of you who celebrate birthdays or anniversaries in August would question my thinking about what happens in August.

A quick web search showed me that every day in August has some kind of honor attached to it. To be sure, many of these are designations from commercial concerns (National Mustard Day, National Waffle Day, both on August 5), some are from interest groups (August 7 - National Kidsday; August 13 - International Lefthanders Day), and some are just silly notions being promoted by who knows who (August 31 - Love Litigating Lawyers Day comes to mind). We also learn that August is National Win With Civility Month (we could use several months on that!), as well as Family Fun Month (just one month?). And let's not omit from our agendas National Simplify Your Life Week, August 4-10 (sounds like a good idea).

Yet the fact remains that August has no true national holidays like Independence Day or Thanksgiving Day. There are no three-day weekends in August (of course, you could devise one of those on your own, but I'll bet your employer won't pay you for the time off). Unless Monday is your usual day off, in August you will be at work.

We may be inclined to think, "Well and good! I can use a little down time. I'm glad nothing much happens in August; I won't have to make any special preparations." Such all-or-nothing thinking usually is not helpful. Instead, our thinking should tend toward, "I have less to do this month. That will leave more time for planning for the important things coming up." That is an excellent way to think (how so? It agrees with how I think, of course!) So here's what I propose.

On Sunday, August 21 (also known as National Senior Citizen's Day and National Spumoni Day) I am asking you to stay after church and spend a few hours planning for the future of our congregation—short-term and long-term. What can we do together to attract new members? What will revitalize our worship and fellowship? What areas of service should we pursue? What are we leaving undone that we need to do? What are we doing now that we should put to an end?

This will not be a Congregational Meeting. We will not vote; we will discuss and, hopefully, come up with a few workable ideas and a plan for action. Food and drink will be available (who knows, maybe even some spumoni); for that reason, a sign-up sheet will be in the narthex so we can anticipate attendance. We will meet in the Fellowship Hall (unless it's really hot that day; then the nave is air conditioned).

I invite you to join us. Please don't leave this to others; you are a vital part of this ministry. We need your input. Come join us on August 21 and together plan our future. We will, of course, begin in prayer — I ask you to begin that now.
