

"... and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit ..."

I read those words in the Pentecost narrative, and I wonder: "What was that like?" I have had some "spiritual moments." I have been with many people who are happy to tell me about how and where and why the Spirit has touched their lives. I have had some experiences where I have known the power and presence of the Spirit. But I have no concept of what it must be like to be "filled with the Holy Spirit".

Taken literally, that phrase would tell us that there was nothing left in the disciples — everything human had been displaced by the Spirit; they were "filled." Yet they continue to act as humans, react as humans, move as humans, speak as humans. So it cannot mean that this was like some scene out of a space movie where the aliens take over human bodies and personalities.

We comprehend that being filled with the Holy Spirit means that they were given a whopping, huge measure of spiritual grace unlike anything they had heretofore experienced. We probably also are convinced that such an outpouring is not in the cards for us. But why would we assume this? Because it has not happened to us ... yet.

That was true of the disciples in the Acts 2. They never had so much as an inking of this power. They had been taught by Jesus about the Spirit. They had been promised that the Spirit was coming. In the post-resurrection narrative where the Risen Christ appears to them in the upper room, He breathed on them (the Greek could also be translated "He in-spirited them") and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." In that instance, there was no manifestation of the Spirit.

So we are left to conclude that there is a difference between receiving the Holy Spirit and being filled with the Spirit. We proclaim that, in Baptism, we receive the Holy Spirit. So there you are — we don't get to be filled (??).

Back up just a bit. The earliest disciples got both; why do we conclude that God could not do both in and for us? "He just won't or wouldn't," is not a satisfying answer (although many of us choose to be content with it). So let's go back to look at what happened back then to see if we can pull out anything instructive.

At the Ascension, Jesus gave specific instructions: "... stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24:49). What did they do? They went back to the city (Jerusalem), Luke tells us, and "were constantly devoting themselves to prayer ..." (Acts 1:15). On the Day of Pentecost "they were all together in one place" (Acts 2:1). What do we learn? First, they were obedient. Second, they were prayerful. Third, they were in community. In short, they were positioning themselves (or were being positioned) for what God was going to do.

They trusted the promise — "clothed with power from on high." They had faith that something extraordinary was going to happen (that phrase doe not lend itself to thinking the mundane was

about to unfold). They did not know what this all meant. They did not know when this would occur. They had no idea what it would mean for them. They simply gave themselves over to what Jesus told them to do, and got themselves ready.

So must we. Pray that God will awaken our congregation to want the "more" that the Spirit offers. Pray for yourself that you will be positioned to receive what the Spirit brings. Pray that there will be a great outpouring of Spirit-empowering energy and hope. Then join with the community is worship, study, and witness so that we are equipped to be used by the Spirit.

Sermon: "A Well-earned Reputation"


Texts: 1 Kings 17:17-24; Psalm 96; Galatians 1:11-24; Luke 7:11-17


