Luke records in Ac's chapter 20 what is regarded as St. Paul's farewell address to the church he had helped to establish in Ephesus. It is something to be read with a sense of sadness, especially when Paul says hal way through, "And now I know that none of you, among whom I have gone about proclaiming the kingdom, will ever see my face again" [20:25]. The note of sadness is there because we know that not too long thereafter Paul will be arrested, shipped to Rome for trial before Caesar, under house arrest, and that the Book of Acts will conclude with this message: "He lived there [in a house in Rome] for two whole years at his own expense and welcomed all who came to him, proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance." [Acts 28:30-31]

I will not try to match St. Paul's pathos or eloquence with a farewell address. First, I have no prophetic idea that our faces will never pass one another (sorry, you'll have to live with the possibility that my puss may be visible). I cannot claim with Paul "I am on my way to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there" [20:22]; I have no plans for travel to Jerusalem, but it is true that I don't know what is going to happen to me (I do have some scheduled preaching assignments the next few months, and my work with the English District Ministerial Health Commission continues, other than that . . .?).

I can with confidence offer this: "And now I commend you to God and to the message of his grace, a message that is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all who are sanctified" [20:32]. I am most hopeful that the shared pastorate with Christ Lutheran will be a blessing to both congregations, and that the continued proclamation of the Gospel will be a bountiful source of strength, hope, joy, and excitement for St. Thomas' people.

Since my assigned tasks for preaching here will conclude on July 2 (Pastor Martzowka has confirmed that he will be stepping in on the 9th), I will give my last "blurb" for worship for that day.


