


A meditation based on Romans 12:3-8

What did Jesus look like? What color was His hair? Was it long like it is in many of the Jesus movies, or was it short and curly? Did He have a beard? How tall was He? The Bible doesn't answer any of these questions. It isn't so concerned about Jesus' appearance. (At least when His appearance isn't revealing the Glory of God as it did in the Transfiguration.) Jesus, the divine Son of God

born a human, had a distinct human body just like the rest of us. Since Jesus remains truly man for all eternity, He still possesses His particular human body even in His glorious resurrection (Luke 24:39; John 20:20). Where the divine Son of God is, there is His human body. From the moment of His human conception, God the Son is inseparable from His human nature. This is one of the truths we confess when we say the Word became flesh.

But Paul shares with us another strange truth related to this one. We Christians are parts of Christ's body (Romans 12:4-5). How does this work? God has united us to His Son's body through Baptism. In Baptism, we put on Christ (Galatians 3:27). Through Baptism, we became members of His one body, the Church (1 Corinthians 12:12-13). So when you ask yourself, where can I see Jesus? Look at the face of your brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus. They are Christ's body as well. Look in the mirror. There is Christ, united to you through baptism. You are now a member of His body. Hence, when you care for the bodily needs of your fellow Christian, you care for Christ Jesus, your Lord (Matthew 25:40). And one of the ways Christ Jesus cares for the world is through you, His member.

Our unity as the body of Christ also means that we gather together. For our relationship with Jesus is tied up with His Church. Christianity is not merely a me and Jesus thing. It is an us and Jesus thing. Sure, each individual is united to Christ, and He knows each and every one of us by name. And just as members of a body are distinct from each other in function and ability, so are we. We, however, are not alone in this world. Christ has given Himself to us, and with Himself, He has given us each other, His body. For where the Son of God is, there is His body also.


