

The death of Jesus marked the end of His movement. His disciples went into hiding, knowing that the Romans and Jewish authorities would be after anyone who supported a man executed as a political rebel, "The King of the Jews." Jesus had taught that the kingdom of God, the restoration of heaven and earth, was coming through Him. He identified Himself as the Son of Man who would rule the renewed heavens and earth on the throne of God, the throne of Glory, and who would judge all people (Matt. 25:31). He claimed that He was able to know the will of Israel's God most intimately because the God of Israel was none other than His Father, and no one knows the Father like the Son (Matt. 11:27). Yet, instead of the restoration of all things came Jesus' death. To His disciples and everyone around them, this death marked the end of faith in Jesus and His message.

To the surprise of His earliest followers, however, the story did not end there. The Jesus movement did not end with His death because His death was not His end. Three days after His crucifixion some of His female followers went to His grave to anoint His dead body. Instead of finding the body of their rabbi, they found an empty tomb. On their way back to report this

incident, Mary Magdalene, one of Jesus' female followers, encountered Jesus risen bodily from the dead and even touched His body for herself. Jesus' male followers and anyone else in the ancient world would not believe the account of the women and Mary, for a patriarchal society in which they lived deemed their testimony and the testimony of all women to be unreliable (Luke 24:11).

Moreover, the risen Jesus appeared to His other followers soon after, allowing them to touch His body for themselves lest they should think that He was merely a spirit or phantasm (Luke 24:39; also John 20:24-29). Jesus also appeared to men who had not believed in Him during His earthly ministry. He appeared to His biological brother James, who had previously believed Jesus to be out of His mind. He appeared to Saul of Tarsus, who had previously regarded Jesus as a false messiah and sought to stomp out His movement with violent force. The risen Jesus also appeared to a group of 500 people at once (1 Corinthians 15:3-11). Those who saw the risen Jesus concluded that Jesus was right. The kingdom of God, the restoration of all things, had come and it had begun with the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, the first fruits of those who sleep and the firstborn of a restored creation. And since the kingdom of God had come in Jesus, there was no doubt that Jesus was the Son of God (hence His knowledge of God's will) and the promised Son of Man who has authority equal to God, authority over heaven and earth, even death itself. Peter, James, and Paul went to their deaths for this confession, convinced that it was true. No one dies for something they know to be a lie.

The resurrection of Jesus attested to by His empty tomb and the numerous people who saw, heard, and touched the risen Jesus revived the Jesus movement and its foundational confession: Jesus is Lord and God has raised Him from the dead. If Jesus has not been raised our faith is in vain. Jesus has been raised, so rejoice! For Jesus has promised that those who believe in Him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16). Amen.


