Hebrews describes the Word of God as a two-edged sword (Hebrews 4:12). A two-edged sword is a sword with a cutting edge on both sides of the blade. Such swords were used offensively in military conflict. Similarly, in the Book of Revelation, the Word of God which comes from Jesus' mouth is portrayed symbolically as a sword (Revelation 19:15). One can use a sword offensively (to attack) or defensively (to protect). God has given us His Word to use both ways. We have many enemies who would seek to separate us from our ultimate good: eternal communion with God. They would do anything to keep us from seeing eternal life. They would have us doubt that Jesus has saved us from sin and death. They would have us question that God has more in store for us beyond this life in a renewed heavens and earth. They would have us focus all our attention, hope, and sense of fulfillment on this world.

Who are these enemies? They are none other than our sinful flesh, the world around us, and the devil. Notice that it begins within. We are our worst enemy. We carry around in our flesh the sinful corruption of doubt that would have us reject God's Word, disobey His commandments, and regard His promises as no more than pie in the sky. The world can also be our enemy when it draws us away from Christ Jesus with its culturally determined human opinions, momentary and fleeting riches, and the evils surrounding us. The devil and those other angels who rebelled against God would also have us trust in something other than God by telling us lies, tempting us to sin, and subjecting us to hardships. How do we defend ourselves from such enemies when surrounded from within and without?

The Scriptures tell us: The Word of God. The Word of God is a defensive weapon because, through God's Law, it warns us about the plans of our sinful flesh to lead us astray, with the promise of salvation it emboldens us to endure the hardships of this world, and with the truth of God, it opposes the lies of the Devil. Similarly, the Word of God is offensive because it strengthens the new life we have with Christ Jesus through the forgiveness of sins, it arms us with true purpose by telling us how God views us versus what this world wants us to be, and it gives us the true promises of God to throw verbally at the Devil when he comes our way. May the Word of God — written in Scripture, proclaimed by the Church, and visible in the water of your Baptism and the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper — strengthen and preserve you until life everlasting. As a Christian, you're surrounded by enemies within and without. Too bad for them. Remain in God's Word. Amen.

BIBLE STUDY THURSDAYS 6:00 P.M. Statement of Faith

At a recent meeting after our bible study a group of members discussed a statement of faith and this is what they all agreed on.

Scriptural – We believe and proclaim that the writings of the Old and New Testaments are the Word of God without error in their entirety delivered through His prophets and apostles and therefore the only rule and norm for the Christian faith (sola Scriptura).

In summary: The Old and New Testaments are entirely the Word of God and thus the authority for the Christian faith.

Evangelical – We believe and proclaim that forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation have been obtained for us by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus apart from any works of our own (solus Christus). This good news (Gospel) is the central message of Scripture and the Christian faith.

In summary: The central message of Scripture is the promise of salvation in Christ Jesus, the Gospel.

Confessional – We believe and proclaim that the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian creeds are faithful confessions of the Christian faith in accordance with the Scriptures and that Martin Luther's Small Catechism (1529) is likewise a faithful confession of the Christian faith in accordance with the Scriptures. These writings confess with the Christian Church throughout all time that there is one God who is three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Holy Trinity); that Christ Jesus, the Son made man, is fully God and fully human; and that salvation is wrought solely by God's love for us apart from any works of our own (sola gratia). In summary: The Ecumenical Creeds and Martin Luther's Small Catechism faithfully teach the Christian faith in accordance with Scripture.

Sacramental – We believe and proclaim that salvation as accomplished by Christ comes from outside of ourselves as a gift of God. This gift is delivered by the Holy Spirit in its entirety through the proclamation of the Gospel, Holy Baptism, Holy Absolution, and the Lord's Supper and received through faith in Christ Jesus (sola fide).

In summary: The Gospel delivers God's free gift of salvation for all people and is received through faith.

Liturgical – We believe and proclaim that Christians are the family of God in Christ Jesus (the Christian Church) and therefore should gather together regularly to receive the gifts of God for nourishment of faith and to support one another throughout their Christian life with prayer, acts of mercy, and fellowship (soli Deo gloria).

In summary: The Christian life is lived in faith toward God, love toward neighbor, and community with the Church.
