

# The Parish Voice

Suffering is only a problem if God exists. If there is no God, then suffering is just a part of existence like atoms, water, and air. It is neither good or bad. Suffering just happens. There are no valid grounds for the organism to complain about the life they have. Therefore, the argument against God's existence on the basis of suffering only works if God actually exists. Whenever we experience suffering, we have a sense that things are not the way that they should be. We are convinced that suffering is not just a part of existence but that it is wrong. Some people try to overcome this natural response to suffering through meditation or by tricking themselves into believing that there is not right and wrong. This sense of wrongness in response to suffering testifies to the fact that the life we experience in this world is disordered, which is only true if there is a God, a personal being who created all things and hence has a will for His creation not yet fully realized in the world.

Scripture testifies that out of love God created all things and that He made them *good*. Suffering came into the world through the sin of man which alienated him from his Creator. By willfully rebelling against his Creator, man rejected the good order created by the Creator and opened himself to the disorder, death, and suffering experienced in our world today (Romans 5:12). And since God had given man responsibility to care for creation, now all creation suffers and reaps the fruit of its negligent steward (Genesis 1:26; Romans 8:20). The suffering we experience in the world, then, stands as a testimony against man's waywardness and the fact that we are born alienated from our Creator (the source of all life and goodness) without any fear, love, or trust in Him. Yet things in the world could be a lot worse than they are. Complete separation from the Creator means non-existence. So, the question we should ask is why do things continue to exist and why is there any good in the world as opposed to perpetual suffering?

The world continues to exist because God, our creator, continues to love His creation and desires to save it. For this reason, He continues to sustain creation by giving us air to breath, food to eat, clothes to wear and children to love. He preserves this creation instead of starting all over because He loves this creation and not another. He continues to create new generations of human beings because He loves wayward Adam and all of His rebellious descendants. He loves you. "[God our Savior] desires all people to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth." (1 Timothy 2:4) Moreover, God wills that this "creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." (Romans 8:21) God preserves this creation for the time being in its brokenness because He intends to repair it. It is this God of love who uses all things, even suffering, for the good of those who love Him (Romans 8:28).

In order to save us and creation, God has even become one with this creation by assuming our humanity and becoming man in the womb of the Virgin Mary (John 1:14). As part of our creation, He willingly lived the highs and lows of our present existence. He partied with family, friends, and strangers. Out of love, He helped the poor, healed the sick, and sought the wayward. He suffered rejection, isolation, insults, the death of loved ones, and even an excruciating and ignominious death on a cross. God became fully human and a part of creation in person and deed so that He might redeem creation. It is this individual who fully God and fully man conquered suffering and the grave as the first fruits of a new creation through His bodily resurrection from the dead (1 Corinthians 15:23). This individual is none other than our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who has reconciled the wayward creation to Himself through His incarnation, life, death, and resurrection so that we

have the sure hope of eternal life and the restoration of all the good creation He dearly loves (1 Peter 1:3).

Suffering is a problem in this life, a problem resulting from human sin, yet a problem that God has and can use for a greater good, and a problem that God has promised to deliver us from on that day when we shall see Him face to face. God loves this creation and so He preserves it for the time being – imperfections and all. He has preserved this creation to redeem and restore it through Christ Jesus. He is not done sharing the news and hope of this salvation with humans in this creation, so people continue to be born into this world. Whatever suffering comes our way, we remember that a loving and good God is in control of all things and He has given us and all creation victory through Christ Jesus our Lord and Savior. We can even rejoice in our suffering knowing that what we experience is what our Lord experienced and because we share in His suffering we shall also share in His resurrection (Romans 8:17-18). Amen.
