In Germany the Lutheran Christian Church is called the Evangelische Kirche (Evangelical Church). "Lutheran" was a name given to the confessional movement within the Western Church by those who opposed it, identifying the movement with its supposed "chief heretic"

Martin Luther. "Evangelical" is the Lutheran Church's preferred name for itself since they are the OG evangelicals (not to mention the thousand years of Christian traditions before it). Evangelical means "devoted to the Gospel." In accord with Scripture, we confess that the Gospel is the center of the Christian faith. The Gospel, as we know, is the promise of salvation in Christ Jesus apart from anything we do. Out of love God the Father has sent His only begotten Son into the world in order to save us from sin, death, and the devil through His becoming our fellow man, fulfilling God's will for us through His obedience, suffering the condemnation for our sin we deserve by dying on the cross, and conquering death by rising bodily from the dead. On account of Christ Jesus, God promises and so gives us His unmerited love, the forgiveness of sins, and everlasting life through the Gospel in its various forms, let it be written, preached, poured over us, or placed on our tongues to eat and drink. Faith is nothing other than God the Holy Spirit grasping us with this promise of salvation.

This Gospel is at the center of the Christian faith because it is at the center of Scripture. As our Lord says, "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me..." (John 5:39) Since all Scripture bears witness to Christ, it should be no surprise to us that the risen Jesus taught the disciples on the road to Emmaus about Himself by going through the Old Testament: "And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself." (Luke 24:27) If we are not interpreting the Holy Scriptures in light of what Christ has done for us, then we are not interpreting them correctly. Similarly, since the Gospel is God's promise given to us, we must interpret our own lives in light of the Gospel. The Gospel tells us who we are on account of Christ Jesus: forgiven sinners, beloved children of God, heirs of everlasting life. We never transcend or get beyond the Gospel in our lives because are sinners in need of forgiveness, people thrown to and fro in this world in need of an identity that doesn't change, and mortals in need of life without end. We can never have too much Gospel in this life because it is the Gospel which is the power of salvation to those who believe (Romans 1:16). This Reformation, we give thanks for the restoration of the pure preaching of the Gospel, and we (or at least I do) proudly bear the name evangelischer Christ (Evangelical Christian).
